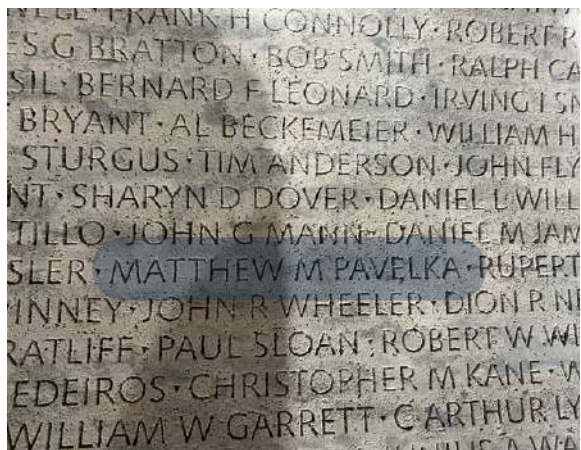

Burbank Police Honor Fallen Officers In Washington D.C.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day. Each year, the Burbank Police Foundation sends two Burbank Police Officers' Association members to the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington D.C. for National Police Week, a time period devoted to paying tribute and honoring those law enforcement officers who have given their lives in the line of duty.

This year, Sergeant Fletcher Stone and Sergeant John Embleton represented the Burbank Police Department in Washington D.C. and visited the Memorial Wall, where the names of over 21,000 fallen law enforcement officers are etched in stone.

The Burbank Police Officers' Association appreciates and thanks the Burbank Police Foundation's and Burbank Police Department's support each year for this meaningful trip.



Burbank Police Participate in the Police Unity Tour

2023 will mark the 20-year anniversary of the line-of-duty death of Burbank Police Officer Matthew Pavelka. As a way to honor his legacy, six current and three retired Burbank Police officers traveled back east in early May to ride in the Police Unity Tour, as members of the Southern California Chapter.

The Police Unity Tour is an annual bike ride that begins in various cities along the east coast and concludes at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C. to mark the start of National Police Week. This year, over 3,300 riders participated from all over the country. Burbank Police riders started their 3-day route in Somerset, New Jersey, and rode over 250 miles through Pennsylvania, Delaware, and Maryland before arriving in the nation's capital. The culmination of the tour was when all riders had the honor of pedaling around the Law Enforcement Officers Memorial wall, where the names of over 23,000 law enforcements officers are inscribed who lost their lives in the line of duty. The Police Unity Tour motto is, "We Ride for Those who Died."

arrests, citations, warnings, and education. Through these methods and efforts, we strive to educate our community on the importance of safe driving and we aim to keep our community safe.

A WILD RIDE WITH A GOOD OUTCOME

On May 23, 2023, at about 12:30 am., Burbank Police officers responded to the area of Riverside Drive and Mariposa Street regarding a loose horse. A concerned citizen said she saw a riderless horse running “frantically” down the street with a saddle leading her to believe a rider may have fallen off and was hurt.

When the officers arrived, they located the horse grazing on the grass in front of a residence. The horse had a saddle, but no bridle attached. Burbank Police Officer Nicholas Moreno grew up around horses and calmly mounted the animal.

Another responding officer found the owner of the horse at the Mariposa Bridge, located at Valley Heart Drive and Mariposa Street. The owner said his horse, Oreo, got spooked after the ride and took off.

Officer Moreno rode Oreo back to the owner where the two were happily reunited.

The Armenian Church Youth Organization of St. Leon Armenian Apostolic Church



On May 12, 2023, the Burbank Police Department was invited to St. Leon Armenian Apostolic Church to speak with the Armenian Church Youth Organization (ACYO) about the dangers of reckless and distracted driving.

This group presentation and discussion was a condensed version of the Department's driver education curriculum titled, "Mindfulness for Young Drivers."

Attendees learned the importance of safe driving through candid conversation and a variety of topics, which included driving permits and provisional licenses, rules of the road, distracted driving, reckless driving (speed), the importance of seatbelts, traffic collisions and what to do if involved in a collision, and the dangers of driving while impaired. The goal of the program is to educate the young members of our community about the responsibilities that come with the privilege of driving and the importance of safe driving behaviors.

COYOTE

AWARENESS

Coyotes are indigenous to the Verdugo Mountains and sightings of them in residential areas are common during this time of year. Typically, coyotes are more active in the spring and early summer when caring for their young and in search of food and water. Coyotes are naturally fearful of humans, but they may become less apprehensive if given easy access to human food and garbage. The following information has been provided by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to assist residents in communities where coyotes frequent:

DO:

- Trim ground level shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Put garbage in tightly-closed containers that cannot be tipped over.
- Remove sources of water, especially in dry climates.
- Bring pets in at night.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Provide secure enclosures for rabbits, poultry and other small pets.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Install motion-sensing lights or sprinklers around the house.
- Make loud noises if followed by a coyote. If this fails, throw rocks in the animal's direction.
- Ask your neighbors to follow these tips.

DON'T:

- Feed or attempt to tame coyotes.
- Leave small children or pets outside, unattended.
- Leave pet food outside.

Coyotes play a key role in the ecosystem by helping to keep rodent populations under control. Mindful consideration of the precautions listed above will create a manageable co-habitation between the City's residents and local wildlife. 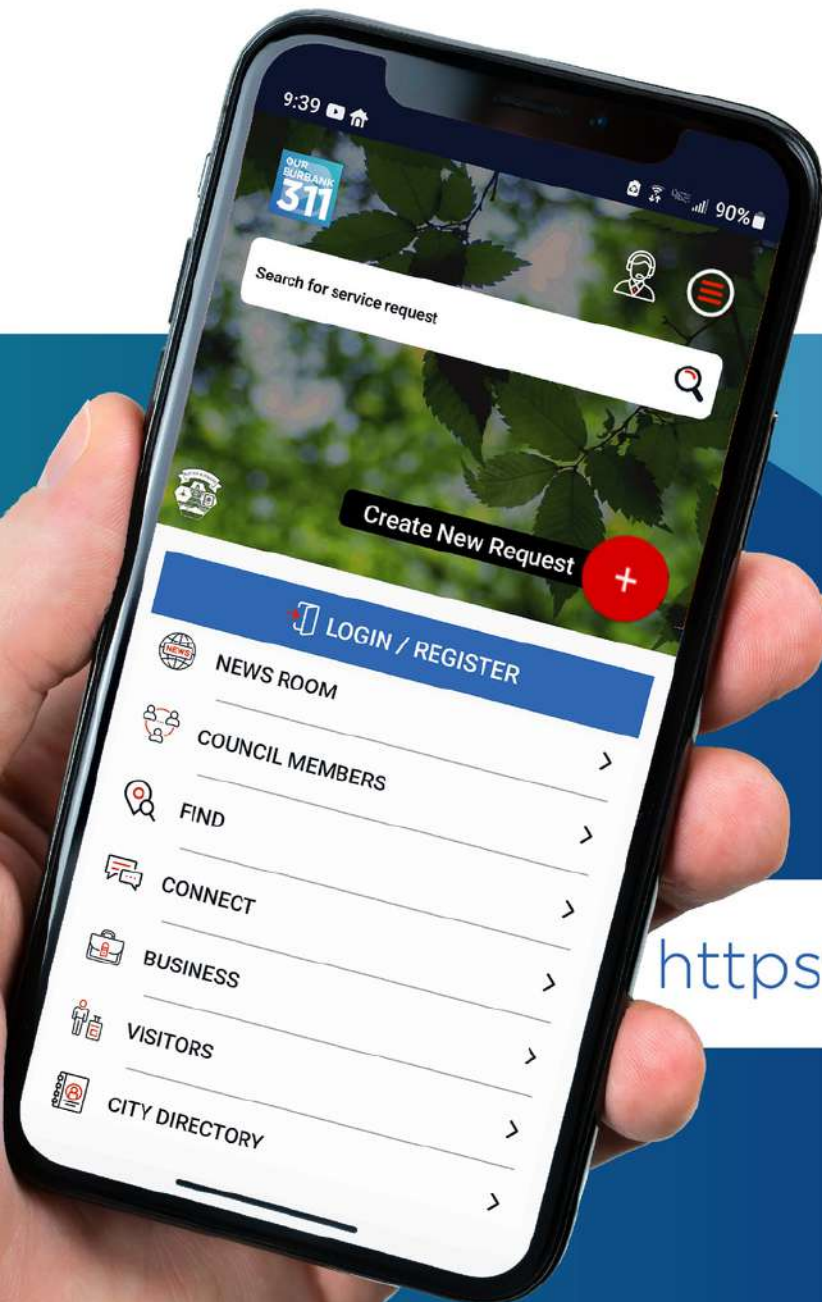
